FOR SANDY SOIL GARDEN

When **planting in sandy soil**, it's important to enrich the soil by adding compost or a quality soil mix containing sphagnum peat moss and nutrients, such as our **All Purpose Mix**. It's important to water the plants thoroughly until they are well-established and to cover the soil with mulch to retain moisture and reduce stress during hot summer days.

Once established, many ornamental plants, shrubs, trees, bulbs and grasses thrive in sandy soil. In fact, many plants prefer well-drained soil (sandy soils dry out quickly) and dislike waterlogged conditions.
